



Metropolitan Police Service Announcement

The Metropolitan Police Service is looking to engage with interpreters who are qualified, experienced and skilled in Kinyarwanda - English interpreting and translation to assist the War Crimes Team who have national responsibility for investigations into Genocide, Crimes against Humanity, War Crimes, Torture, and Cultural Destruction.

The engagement will call for assistance in the translation of documentation, video-recorded witness interviews and be involved in UK court hearings.

With more than 8 million people living in London and speaking over 300 different languages, making sure the police can effectively engage with local communities is key to building public trust and confidence.

In order to register under the Rare Language category, the applicants must have a UK address. In addition, the applicants would need to provide evidence of having passed a qualification that tests spoken and written English equivalent to IELTS band score 7.0 or above (CEFR C1), such as: Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE), Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE) and IELTS.
