

Border Security, Asylum and Immigration Bill

The Border Security, Asylum and Immigration Bill is currently being debated at its Report stage, with the final day of the debate for the whole House happening on **November 11, 2025**.

At this stage, Members debate and decide on amendments to the bill, with related amendments grouped together for discussion.

- **Current Status:** The Bill is at its Report stage in the House of Lords.
- **Next Event:** The final day of the report stage is today, November 11, 2025.
- **What happens at Report Stage:** The whole House debates and votes on amendments that have been proposed to the Bill.
- **Background:** The Bill was introduced to the House of Commons on January 30, 2025, and has already passed its Second Reading and Committee stage

Baroness Coussins has tabled an amendment, sponsored by Baroness Morris of Yardley and Lord Sherbourne of Didsbury:

Translation and interpreting services

Immigrants and asylum seekers shall have the right, when needed, to professional, qualified translators and interpreters in relation to all oral and written communications concerning—

- (a) deportation,
- (b) detention,
- (c) control,
- (d) biometric data,
- (e) residency schemes and rules,
- (f) monitoring devices,
- (g) appeals,
- (h) accommodation, and
- (i) any other procedure mentioned in Part 2
