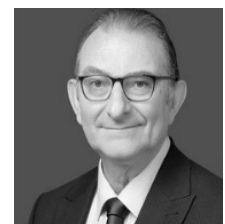
This training program should improve psychologists' knowledge, skills and the confidence required to work effectively alongside interpreters in mental health settings.
